Call for Oral Historian, Independent Project

Sharon Millerchip is looking for an oral historian to interview her father-in-law Quentin Anthony. Quentin is currently on the list of potential interviewees for The Oral History and Indigenous Programme at the National Library, but as this waiting list is considerable she is interested in engaging an oral historian to conduct a series of interviews that the family would record and hold.

Quentin lives on the Central Coast of NSW and it would be ideal to find someone located close by, but she is willing to consider candidates from central Sydney.

Sharon is seeking an interviewer with a distinct interest and expertise in the below fields, as Quentin has lived a marvelous breadth of experiences - from his wartime childhood, his 15 years as Patrol Officer in Tribal New Guinea in the 1950's, his 30 year career internationally and in Australia with ASIO and his later years as a veteran athlete and coach at the Aust Institute of Sport.

Voices of Resistance and Hope

This project aims to enhance the understanding, research, and teaching of Ukraine's recent history in the international academic field and, more broadly, in global narratives about protest movements, activism, and solidarity. Therefore, our task was to translate the collection materials into English and make them available on the website of the Urban Media Archive of the Center for Urban

History.

The formation of the oral history collection began in 2013, a few weeks after people across all of Ukraine took to the streets to protest the decision not to sign the Ukraine-European Union Association Agreement in favor of closer political and economic relations with Russia and to protest the brutal dispersal and beating of the first protesters in Kyiv. The interview responses were gathered in two stages, the first in December 2013 and the second in February 2014.

This collection has a unique potential to better our understanding of the individual at the Euromaidan protests – their beliefs, opinions, motives, and roles – as those categories usually get lost within analyses of the Euromaidan protests as a collective action.
